STANDING BEFORE THE KING!

Acts 26

Intro: A. The Gospel of Jesus Christ is for every person n planet earth.

- It is needed equally by the rich, the poor; the high and lifted up, the cast down.
- The Gospel teaches us that all are sinners and need a Savior.. (Rom. 3:23). Because the wages of sin is damnation in a sinner's hell. (Rom. 6:23).
- B. We have here in our lesson text, Paul the prisoner, standing before King Agrippa.
 - 1. Felix had left Paul in prison, simply to please His accusers, the Jews.
 - 2. Festus could not find anything to charge Paul with, nor did Pilate.
 - Now Agrippa, his wife, Bernice, and Festus listen as Paul tells his story to them.
- C. Let's listen in as Paul's tells his story to the King.

I. 1ST, HE SAID THAT JESUS CHANGED THE DESTINATION OF HIS SOUL! (VSS. 3-15).

- A. As a young man Paul was concerned about his soul.
 - 1. He was very strict in the religion of his youth.
 - 2. He lived as a Pharisee, trying to keep the Law.
 - He excelled in his religion far above most; He was a Pharisee among Pharisees.
- B. Paul persecuted Christians in order to "gain favor with God".
 - 1. He really believed that God would be pleased with his opposition to Jesus.
 - 2. He had all believers thrown into prison and was glad when they were put to death.
 - One such example was when he stood by watching Deacon Stephen die after being beaten and stoned by Paul's soldiers.
- C. But then came decision day for Paul.on the road to Damascus to persecute more Christians.
 - 1. At high noon. A light brighter than the sun, illuminated the road.
 - 2. Paul heard a voice and knew immediately that it was the voice of the Lord.
 - 3. He said I was not disobedient unto the Heavenly command, "Lord, what will you have me to do?"

II. 2ND, JESUS CHANGED THE DIRECTION OF HIS LIFE! (VSS. 16-25)

- A. Paul was commissioned for a life of service to Christ.
 - 1. "to make thee a minister and a witness." (vs. 16).
 - 2. Paul ministered to open the eyes of those in spiritual darkness.
 - 3. He ministered to turn people from the power of Satan to the power of God.
 - He ministered to bring people from the pits of hell to the streets of gold in the heavenly city.
- B. Paul's obedience had brought him to this place and into the hands of His accusers.

- C. When he began to fulfill his call from God, trouble came!
 - Enemies of the Gospel tried to kill him. As Jesus had said at the entry to the Garden of Gethsemane to Judas, "Friend, I do thee no harm".
 - But Paul continued to preach about the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus Christ.
 - 3. And now he is taking advantage to present the Gospel message to the king.

III. 3RD, JESUS CHANGED THE DESIRES OF PAUL'S HEART! (VSS. 26-29)

- A. His former desires was to do away with Christians heir message.
- B. Now preaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ was his only passion.
 - Place Paul anywhere and he will tell others of God's love.
 - 2. He will tell all about his conversion.
- C. Paul desired for Agrippa, his wife and Festus to know Jesus .
- D. What is the driving desire of your heart? Is it at all to tell anyone about Jesus and His salvation?

<u>CONCLUSION:</u> What about the destination of your soul? King Agrippa was almost persuaded to become a Christian. What about you? "Almost is to fail. Almost but lost!
